ITINERARY SUMMER '26

- Day 1 Departure from the USA.
- Day 2 Arrival Buenos Aires Airport. Transfer to your accommodation. After check-in, we'll offer the group a walking tour to explore the area around your hotel as well as a light training session.
- Day 3 Guided bus tour of Buenos Aires. Located in a relatively compact area near the old colonial heart of the city, the Plaza de Mayo was established in 1580, the main sites include the Pink, Colon Theater, Government Palace, and the world's widest avenue – la 9 de Julio – with its Obelisco monument. Late afternoon optional community service project. **Evening game vs. a local team.**
- Day 4 Day trip to La Boca. The city's historical Little Italy where El Caminito, a historical pedestrian zone is located. Afternoon visit the Boca Juniors Football Stadium as well as the museum, popularly known as La Bombonera (the Chocolate Box). From the outside, the stadium seems to be part of the scale model exhibited in the museum depicting this famous neighborhood. Everything is intertwined and indivisible: not only is La Bombonera a part of a neighborhood that witnessed its creation, but it also defines its identity. It was in this port suburb that football and Argentina were born. For the evening, we recommend attending a Tango Show (the extra cost for this Tango show is approx. \$100.00 per person and it includes dinner, wine, tango class, and the show); the dance originated in lower-class districts of Buenos Aires and the music was derived from the fusion of various forms of music from Europe. The first association of Tango with its distinctive music and dance is recorded circa 1890s.
- Day 5 Morning walking tour to Calle Florida and La Galleria Pacifico: shopping at Calle Florida with live performing artists in the streets, later time for shopping at Galerias Pacifico Artistic Mall.

- Shopping areas in Buenos Aires are the best places for people-watching and traditional crafts and food. Afternoon community service project. **Evening game vs. a local team.**
- Day 6 Optional Pro Soccer Club Experience Day at a Buenos Aires area pro club. Start in the morning by watching a training session of the first team (if available) with a possible introduction from a player from the first team. After this, tour the stadium, the club museum, and the locker room followed by lunch at the Academy complex and then a training session with a club coach.
- Day 7 Walking tour to the beautiful Recoleta Neighborhood, known for its squares, parks, cafés and galleries. You may also visit the astonishing Recoleta cemetery where the famous Eva Duarte de Peron, most known as "Evita" is buried. Eva was deemed "Spiritual Leader of the Nation" and was a major contributor to women's and low-income rights in Argentina. She was a former actress and married Juan Peron who became president, which is where much of her influence began. Another option for this day is to spend a day in Buenos Aires to explore the city, do your shopping, etc. This option is included in the tour costs. A very nice option is a walking tour of the San Telmo Neighborhood. This is a cool, colonial district with a beautiful antique fair market. You may see performing street artists dancing tango, music bands, etc. During the weekend it is very lively and crowded. **Evening game vs. a local team.**
- Day 8 Morning available to do your final shopping. Afternoon transfer to Buenos Aires Airport and return flight.
- Day 9 Return home.

ACCOMMODATION AND MEALS INCLUDED:

4-star hotel accommodation - daily breakfast and dinner is included. The hotel is centrally located in Buenos Aires, close to several tourist places such as the Plaza de Mayo, and there are also several Metro stations in the surrounding area. Includes accommodation in double and triple rooms for 2-3 people per room with a private bathroom, free Wi-Fi, cable TV, and minibar. The hotel offers its own restaurant and bar/lounge. Single rooms (1 person per room) are available at a supplement of \$50.00 per person per night.



GROUND TRANSPORTATION INCLUDED:

During your entire stay, a private bus will be available exclusively for your group – 10 hours a day.



LOCAL GUIDE SERVICES INCLUDED:

A local tour assistant will be assigned to be exclusively with your group full-time each day during your stay in each destination to provide you with any assistance when necessary and help plan or amend your daily schedule as needed.

NOT INCLUDED ARE:

- Beverages (soda) with meals.
- Gratuities for representatives and bus drivers.
- Admission fees to attractions.

- A visit to a pro soccer game. Admission fee not included. Please calculate between US\$100.00 and US\$200.00 per person depending on the game. Some so-called premium games might be more expensive.
- Pro Club Experience with clinic, stadium tour and lunch at one of the local pro clubs-\$150.00 per person.
- Training session with own coaches - US\$45.00 per person including transportation to and from the fields.
- Community service projects - A soccer clinic with underprivileged children and/or work at a soup kitchen – US\$35.00 per person which includes transportation to/from the community service project.
- Tango Show - US\$120.00 per person including dinner, wine, tango class, and the show.

SIGHTSEEING IN Buenos Aires

Buenos Aires is the capital and most populous city of Argentina. The city is located on the western shore of the estuary of the Río de la Plata, on the South American continent's southeastern coast. Buenos Aires is a top tourist destination and is known for its preserved Spanish/European-style architecture and rich cultural life – it is known as the “Paris of South America”. Buenos Aires held the 1st Pan American Games in 1951 as well as hosting two venues in the 1978 FIFA World Cup. Buenos Aires will host the 2018 Summer Youth Olympics and the 2018 G20 summit. The tango is the national dance of Argentina which originated in the 1880s along the River Plate, the natural border between Argentina and Uruguay, and soon spread to the rest of the world.

PUERTO MADERO

When visitors want to take an evening stroll, many head to Puerto Madero, where dazzling city lights illuminate the port that once served as a major destination for European trade. During the day, this area rests as a quiet business hub, but by night, this little neighborhood bursts with energy. Trendy porteños flock to the neighborhood steak and seafood restaurants and tango at festive dance clubs. Standout spots include Rojo Tango and Asia de Cuba, which are both for their sultry dancing and festive décor.

LA BOCA

This fashionable neighborhood located in southern Buenos Aires brims with trendy boutiques and art galleries. Once a gritty shipyard bustling with European immigrants, this now vibrant port houses local artists, soccer fans, and middle-class workers alike. Its name—which translates to “The Mouth”—is derived from its distinct location near the Río de la Plata (the estuary formed by the meeting of the Uruguay and Paraná rivers).



Make your way to Vuelta de Rocha's triangular plaza and you'll come upon the start of colorful **Caminito**, a popular pedestrian sidewalk flanked by bright murals and shimmering metal houses. Here, you'll also find the taxicab-yellow stadium of Argentina's most popular soccer team, Boca Juniors, along with lively cafés, bars, and casual tango institutions.

RECOLETA CEMETERY

This beloved cemetery—located in the ritzy Recoleta neighborhood—is the resting place of many notable political figures and elites in Argentine history. You'll probably recall Madonna belting out Tim Rice's lyrics "Don't Cry for Me Argentina" in her rendition as Eva "Evita" Perón in the 1978 musical, *Evita*. But what you may not remember is Eva Perón's role as the outspoken and influential First Lady of Argentina in 1946, nor her untimely death at age 33 from cancer. As you stroll through the cemetery, you'll not only catch a glimpse of Ms. Perón's ornate resting place, but also discover a wide array of art nouveau, art deco, and modernist mausoleums. Another highlight is the towering *Círculo Militar*, a black structure imported from Paris that features stunning white marble angels. One TripAdvisor user comments, "It is a necropolis full of architectural art. A visit to the city wouldn't be complete without this."
