Spain – Barcelona and Madrid



ITINERARY MARCH 26- APRIL 3, 2026

- Mar 26 Departure from San Francisco airport.
- Mar 27 Arrival Barcelona airport. Transfer to your accommodation.
- Mar 28 Visit Barcelona by bus and see sights like the Bullring, the Gaudi buildings, Casa Battlló and the Pedrera, Plaza Francesc Masia, the Nou Camp - home of FC Barcelona, followed by Gaudi's unfinished Sagrada Familia Cathedral, and lastly Parque Guell. **Evening game vs. a local team.**
- Mar 29 Morning optional training session. Visit the sacred mountain-top monastery of Montserrat with its breathtaking views. Or take a bus or boat tour to Tossa de Mar, a town known by all for its paradisiacal beaches and its incredible wall, has a great history. Visit the Castle of Tossa de Mar which was built in 1187 on the request of the abbot of Ripoll which also allowed to construct within and outside the fortified area. The castle is located in the old Town 'Vila Vella '
- Mar 30 Free day in Barcelona visiting the places the bus cannot reach. Drop off and pick up point in the central Plaza Catalunya. Recommended are the: Ramblas with its human statues and street artists, Palau de la Musica, Barrio Gótico with its maze of narrow streets, Plaza Real, and Cathedral. **Evening game vs. a local team.**
- Mar 31 Transfer to your accommodation in Madrid.
- Apr 1 Sightseeing Madrid; Puerta del Sol, the Plaza Mayor, the Royal Palace, and the Bernabéu stadium, home of Real Madrid. **Evening game vs. a local team.**

- Apr 2 Experience two UNESCO World Heritage cities in one day on this tour to Toledo and Segovia. See Segovia's narrow streets and preserved Roman aqueduct. Uncover ancient mysteries during a guided tour of the ancient fortress, the Alcázar. In Toledo—the city of three cultures—discover the architecture and history of Muslim, Jewish, and Christian societies who once lived here and take a guided tour of the Cathedral of Toledo (optional).
- Apr 3 Transfer to Madrid airport and return flight.

SPORT PROGRAM INCLUDED:

We will arrange 3 games per team – 2 in Barcelona and 1 in Madrid.



ACCOMMODATION AND MEALS INCLUDED:

Barcelona: 4-star Hotel accommodation in the Costa Brava region in a seaside town like Santa Susanna, Calella, etc.

- Daily breakfast and dinner included.
- The accommodation is situated near the town center and/or beach.
- The distance to Barcelona is approx. 30-35 miles. Accommodation in triple rooms (3 people in either 3 single beds or 2 double beds). All rooms have a private bathroom as well as air-conditioning. Double rooms are available at a supplement of \$15.00 per person per night and single rooms are available at a supplement of \$55.00 per person per night.
- The hotel has a restaurant, bar, lounge, reception, and an outdoor swimming pool.

Madrid: 3-star plus/4-star hotel accommodation on the outskirts of Madrid.

- Daily breakfast and dinner included.
- Hotel in Madrid just outside the city center.
- The hotel has a restaurant and bar/lounge.
- Accommodation in triple rooms (3 people – 1 double bed + 1 sofa bed). All rooms have a TV, telephone, and private bathroom. Double rooms are available as well at a supplement of \$35.00 per person per night and single rooms are available at a supplement of \$145.00 per person per night.



GROUND TRANSPORTATION INCLUDED:

During your entire stay, a private bus will be available exclusively for your group – 10 hours a day.



LOCAL GUIDE SERVICES INCLUDED:

A local tour assistant will be assigned to be exclusively with your group full-time each day during your stay in each destination to provide you with any assistance when necessary and help plan or amend your daily schedule as needed.

CAMP NOU

(Stadium under construction, museum only)

Visit the Home of Barcelona FC: the away team changing room, the players' tunnel, the dugouts, the press room, the commentators' box, and of course, the Museum. The Museum is the most modern football museum thanks to its interactive wall spaces, large-scale audiovisual displays, and an extensive display of objects to explain the history of FC Barcelona and understand the values that make Barça "més que un club" - "more than a club".

SAGRADA FAMILIA

The unfinished Cathedral by Gaudí, the expiatory church of La Sagrada Família, is a work on a grand scale that began on March 19, 1882, from a project by the diocesan architect, Francisco de Paula del Villar (1828-1901). At the end of 1883, Gaudí was commissioned to carry on the work, a task which he did not abandon until he died in 1926. Since then, different architects have continued the work after his original idea.

Montserrat is a multi-peak mountain located near the city of Barcelona. It is well known as the site of the Benedictine abbey, Santa Maria de Montserrat, which hosts the Virgin of Montserrat sanctuary and is identified by some with the location of the Holy Grail in Arthurian myth. The mountain is composed of a strikingly pink conglomerate, a form of sedimentary rock, and Montserrat is Spain's first National Park.



LA RAMBLA & BOQUERIA MARKET

Prices: Free

This busy street is just for pedestrians and is lined with outdoor markets, shops, restaurants, and cafes. La Boqueria is a large public market in the Ciutat Vella district of Barcelona, and one of the city's foremost tourist landmarks, with an entrance from La Rambla, not far from the Liceu, Barcelona's opera house. The market has a very diverse selection of goods.

SIGHTSEEING IN MADRID

Madrid is the capital city of Spain and the largest city in Spain. The city has a population of almost 3.2 million with a metropolitan area population of approximately 6.5 million. It is the third-largest city in the European Union, after London and Berlin, and its metropolitan area is the third largest in the European Union after those of London and Paris.

BERNABEU FOOTBALL STADIUM

The Estadio Santiago Bernabéu is an all-seater football stadium in Madrid, Spain. It was inaugurated on 14 December 1947 and is owned by Real Madrid Club de Fútbol. It has a current capacity of 85454 spectators. El Bernabéu, renamed in honor of their former chairman Santiago Bernabéu Yeste, is one of the world's most famous and prestigious football venues. It has hosted the European Cup final on four occasions: in 1957, 1969, 1980, and the UEFA Champions League Final in 2010. The Bernabéu is both the second-largest stadium in Spain and the second-largest stadium home to a top-flight European club, behind only Camp Nou, home to rival Barcelona.

ROYAL PALACE

The Palacio Real de Madrid is the official residence of the Spanish Royal Family in the city of Madrid but is only used for state ceremonies. King Felipe VI and the Royal Family do not reside in the palace, choosing instead the more modest Palacio de la Zarzuela on the outskirts of Madrid.

The palace is owned by the Spanish State and administered by the Patrimonio Nacional, a public agency of the Ministry of the Presidency. The palace is located on Calle de Bailén (Bailén Street), in the Western part of downtown Madrid, East of the Manzanares River. Several rooms in the palace are regularly open to the public except during state functions.

PRADO MUSEUM

The Museo del Prado is one of the most popular tourist attractions in Madrid. The 18th-century structure designed by architect Juan de Villanueva houses one of the world's finest art collections. A 2007 expansion has made the famed museum easier to navigate. With more than 7,000 works of art representing culture and history from the 12th century to the early 19th century, however, it's impossible to see everything in a single visit. Visitors may wish to focus on the museum's collection of Spanish artists, including Goya, El Greco, da Ribera, and Velázquez, which is inarguably the best collection of Spanish paintings in the world.



PLAZA DE LA VILLA

The Plaza de la Villa is a picturesque small square in the heart of Madrid, not far from the much larger Plaza Mayor. In contrast to the latter, the buildings at the Plaza de la Villa all have contrasting styles. The largest building in the square is the former Town Hall or Casa de la Villa (ayuntamiento). Construction started in 1644 by Juan Gómez de Mora, the architect of the Plaza Mayor.
